There are no family names in Iceland. An Iceland-er's last name is his father's first name with the word for "son" (or "daughter") added to it. When you want to address a person by name, you can use his first and last names together, with the word for Mr., Mrs., or Miss first, or just the first name with Mr., Mrs., or Miss. As:
